The Illinois Traction System comprises over 500 miles of main line track in Illinois, with St. Louis as its southern terminal. It owns and operates freight cars for all classes of business and electric locomotives—all built and equipped in accordance with steam railway standards.

Joint freight rates and physical track connections with steam railways make possible shipments over these lines to or from any point in the United States. Industrial side tracks are provided for use of large industries directly on this line. Carload shipments to or from all industries on other lines in St. Louis, Mo., Granite City, East St. Louis, Springfield, Decatur and Peoria, Ill., are handled under switching arrangements with connecting roads.

The Illinois Traction System has the only independent railway entrance over its own bridge into the heart of St. Louis. Belt lines around the larger cities facilitate the movement of freight, and centrally located warehouses are maintained for the conveniences of shippers.

The Illinois Traction System has applied the same high standards to passenger operation that have made it an efficient freight carrier. Sleeping car service has also been inaugurated between St. Louis and Champaign.

This trunk line electric railway was one of the first in its class to equip its best trains with parlor cars and was the first to offer sleeping car accommodations. The parlor and sleeping car service between St. Louis, Springfield and Peoria has become justly famous with travelers in this central west territory.

Parlor car and de luxe limited trains which operate between St. Louis, Springfield and Peoria afford the maximum of daylight travel comfort. Large upholstered parlor chairs; a roomy, awning'd observation platform; library table; club section for card playing; smoking compartment and a la carte buffet, with courteous attendants, are features of the parlor car service.

Sleeping cars with extra long berths, windows in upper berths and safety deposit vaults for valuables make the night journey between St. Louis, Springfield and Peoria a pleasant memory. There is no smoke or cinders. And, while you sleep aboard the "Owl," you have the satisfaction of knowing that ever watchful electric automatic block signals at all times assure your safety.

The home is the very soul of a city. St. Louis is a city of homes, home folks and a real community spirit. It is a city of happy family groups.

The many pretty residence districts in all parts of the city have given St. Louis a national reputation as a city of beautiful homes. These sections contain dwellings of all classes, from palatial mansions to the modest little homes of wage-earners. Apartment-house sections furnish many comforts and conveniences for tenants. This improvement program of a city-wide nature is extended over a period of ten years, and comprises traffic betterment, city beautification, commercial development, and increase of municipal facilities for the benefit of residents and visitors.

These improvements will provide additional conveniences and recreation facilities for residents, will enhance property values, and will add pleasure to the already enjoyable home life, as well as made St. Louis a greater "City of Homes."

It is estimated that more than \$450,000,000 will be spent by private enterprises in new construction and development as a direct result of this municipal bond issue program.

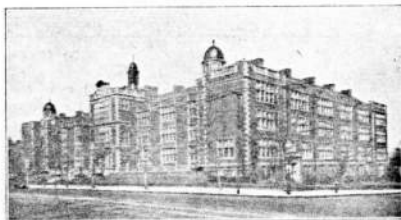

The Gasconade, Current and Big Piney rivers in their winding courses through the Ozarks furnish ideal camping sites, bathing, fishing, boating, hunting and vacation pleasures. Club houses, cabins, rustic cottages and hunting lodges supply accommodations for invigorating leisure and complete rest.

The winding roadways, the cross-country trails and the state highways pass through regions which equal, is not excel, the beauty of any vacation land in America.

The altitude of the Ozark hills makes the air pure and bracing. The sparkling water from the numerous Ozark springs is most refreshing. Camping parties may obtain reliable guides, boats and equipment for floats down the shallow rapids of the Ozark streams.

Missouri has authorized a bond issue of \$60,000,000 for the construction of hard-surfaced roads. This, with Federal aid, will mean the expenditure of more than \$100,000,000 for good roads throughout the state. Many of the main highways are now being built. Less than a half day's drive on these concrete traffic lanes will bring the automobilist to the great Ozark vacation grounds.

The adjacent state of Illinois has likewise passed a bond issue of \$60,000,000, which will result in the building of hard roads costing more than \$100,000,000. Most of these main Illinois highways have been built, and others are in process of construction.

The completion of this road-building program will make it possible for tourists to reach any part of these two states on ribbons of concrete.

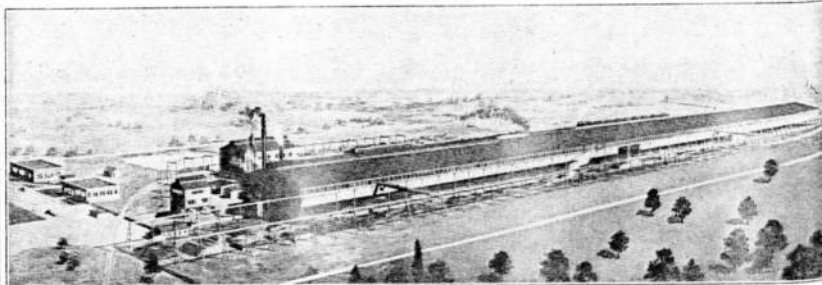

With additional ornamentations and conveniences each year, the playhouse has been developed into the permanent concrete auditorium on a hillside of today, with tier after tier of seats giving a seating capacity of 9,270.

The grassy banks of the River des Peres has been converted into a stage 120 feet wide and 90 feet deep in the natural forest stage setting, with a bridge across the stream leading from stage to dressing rooms.

The St. Louis Fashion Show—a wonderful style pageant—held in August each year in the Municipal Open-Air Theater is recognized as the most complete animated exposition of styles ever staged. It is a colorful spectacle combining vaudeville, circus acts, water sports and scenic effects with an entertaining display of the newest styles on living models.

Although it is designed primarily as a trade exposition and entertainment for the merchants of the Mississippi Valley and great Southwest trade zone, for whom St. Louis is the logical market, the St. Louis Fashion Show is entertaining and fascinating even to those who are not directly interested in its commercial phases.

The enlarged St. Louis Zoo is another of these big civic accomplishments. The people of the city voted a direct tax for the enlargement and maintenance of the zoo, and it has become one of the chief zoological gardens of America. Experts concerned with the captivity of wild animals have come to St. Louis from all sections of the United States to study the methods by which the animal dens and paddocks are being transformed into near-to-nature haunts.

The Mississippi River at St. Louis, with its steamboats, tugboats, modern barges and tows, pleasure craft, four bridges, and ferry boats, flanked by the elevated railroad and skyscrapers of the nearby downtown business districts, forms one of the greatest attractions to visitors and sight-seers. The old section of St. Louis adjacent to the river, now rather desolate but still interesting, forms the district referred to by Charles Dickens in his "American Travels" as the "French Quarter."

St. Louis has a frontage of 19 miles on the Mississippi River, which is spanned by four bridges. The Eads Bridge, besides being an engineering masterpiece, is one of the world's most sightly bridges. It was 10 years in building, and cost approximately \$10,000,000. It has two decks, one for vehicular and pedestrian, and the other for railroad traffic.

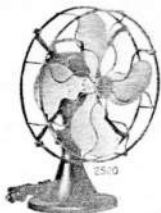
The Municipal Bridge, or "Free Bridge," built by the city for the free passage of vehicles, pedestrians and trains, is two lines long and is the largest double-span steel bridge in the world. The Merchants' Bridge has a single deck and is for railroad traffic only. The McKinley Bridge was built for interurban cars entering St. Louis, and has a roadway for vehicles and path for pedestrians.

St. Louis' commercial and industrial greatness is evidenced by the fact that one out of every five persons in the United States walks in St. Louis shoes. St. Louis is the world's largest shoe market, and has the largest individual shoe manufacturing plant in the world.

When the country goes traveling it uses St. Louis trunks and handbags. St. Louis is the largest trunk market in the United States. St. Louis stoves heat the world. Its ranges cook the country's food. The city is the world's leader in the manufacture and sale of stoves and ranges, and has the largest individual plant in the world making these necessities.

Your summer colds and winter ills are relieved by St. Louis drugs and chemicals. St. Louis has the largest drug house in the world, and is the largest drug and chemical market in the United States. The world rides in St. Louis street cars. St. Louis has the largest street car manufacturing plant in the world, and St. Louis street cars are used in all nations.

Automobiles throughout the world are supplied with St. Louis piston rings. St. Louis is the piston ring center of the universe. The world's sugar is produced with St. Louis sugar-mill machinery. St. Louis is the largest sugar-mill machinery market in the world.

ST. LOUIS, MO.—Continued

A fleet of steel barges operated by the United States Government ply between St. Louis and New Orleans. The barges can move 10,000 tons of merchandise—more than 350 carloads or 10 full trains—in a single tow. They are sending goods from St. Louis to the South and West and beyond—into the Gulf of Mexico, through the Panama Canal, to the markets of the world.

At the modern \$1,000,000 municipal dock in St. Louis, equipped with great steel cranes, one of the Government-operated towboats on the Mississippi can load 10,000 tons and deliver it in New Orleans to one of the trans-Atlantic or trans-Pacific boats, which have about 10,000 tons capacity.

St. Louis' excellent water supply is obtained by the City Waterworks plant from the Mississippi River above the city through two intake towers in midstream. It is filtered through the largest rapid-sand filtration plant in the world, having a capacity of 150,000,000 gallons per day. Clear, pure water is pumped through the mains to the homes and industries in St. Louis.

The climate of St. Louis is so favorable that open-air activities can be enjoyed nine months in the year. It admits of outdoor work more days in the year than any other large industrial center in the United States. The winters are short. Spring and fall are ideal.

The St. Louis public school system is recognized by educators as the most complete in the United States. It has 137 public grade and high schools for white and negro pupils. School books are furnished free to all pupils in both grade and high schools. The public school enrollment is more than 101,000 students.

The grade schools include one school for the deaf, one for dependent and delinquent children, 13 for backward pupils and two open-air schools for children tubercularly inclined.

St. Louis has two of the largest and best educational institutions in America—St. Louis University, and Washington University, with its celebrated schools for girls, Mary Institute. St. Louis University is the oldest Catholic university in the West.

The moral atmosphere in St. Louis is as good as in any metropolis in the country, and better than in most large communities. Its churches of the various denominations and the civic betterment organizations are very active.

The St. Louis Central Public Library building, on the outskirts of the downtown retail section, is one of the best specimens of architecture in the city. It cost approximately \$1,800,000, and was built with funds from an endowment by the late Andrew Carnegie and a direct tax voted by the people.

St. Louis covers 61 square miles, and has within its corporate limits a population of 772,897, according to the Federal census of 1920. Its limits have not been extended since 1876, and there has been no annexation of territory or population within that time. The city has overflowed into its suburbs until, in its metropolitan area, it has a population well in excess of 1,000,000. An aggressive movement is now under way to take into the corporate limits of the city the immediate suburbs, which are an integral part of St. Louis.

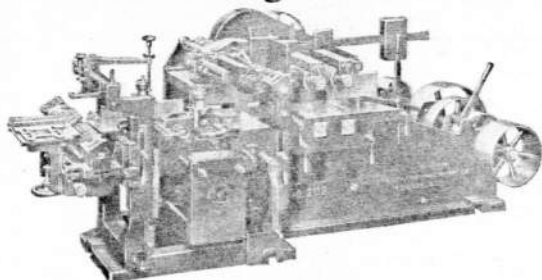

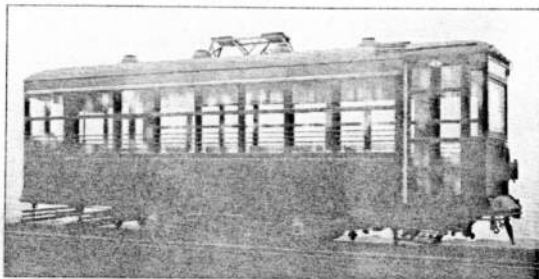

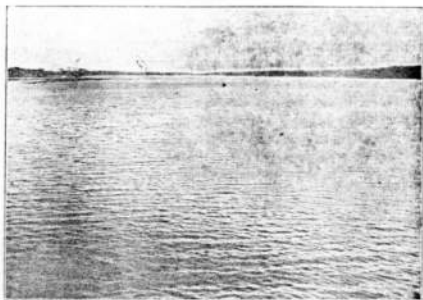
DECATUR, ILL.

Decatur's population approximates 53,000 at present, a constant and steady increase being well maintained since the 1920 census when 43,818 inhabitants were listed.

Decatur, the county seat of Macon County, is located in the heart of the richest agricultural area in the world, the "Illinois Corn Belt."

Decatur's central location in the State, with the advantages given by excellent railroad facilities, affording ideal connections to all parts of the state and country, make the city ideal as a manufacturing and jobbing center. Twelve railroad lines, comprising four systems and three interurban lines furnish direct connections with all principal cities, providing the best possible means for the receipt and distribution of raw materials and manufactured products.

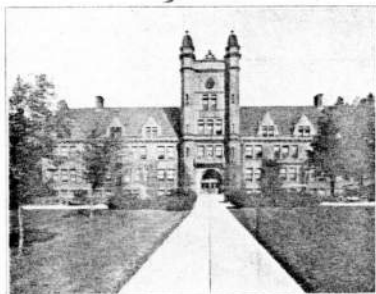

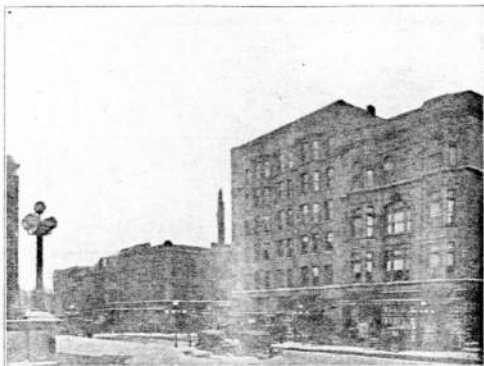

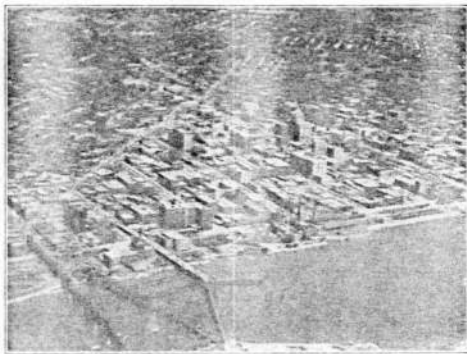
including labor supply, trend of wages, production charts, taxation, labor turnover, and legislation of various kinds are compiled and disseminated through this office. Through the co-operation of its members the organization has functioned very effectively.

Stability of Employment

The diversity of manufacturing interests and of articles produced enables the workmen of the community to keep well employed, and in the event of temporary reduction of forces in any of the plants, there is usually enough employment available to absorb the competent help. Labor pilfering between plants is discouraged in every consistent way. The general industrial atmosphere of the community is healthful and prosperous.

Living Conditions

The City of Peoria as a place to live offers unusual advantages. It is a city of beautiful dwellings. The natural scenery furnishes picturesque settings for its homes. The rents for the City of Peoria, however, are no higher, if as high, as other cities of its size. There are few cities where the percentage of homes occupied by their owners is greater than the City of Peoria. Permits for 1,055 dwellings were issued during 1923.

Peoria has an industrial "incubator" where small institutions may locate and become established without purchasing property, or paying the extreme rentals.

The City of Peoria is following an extremely liberal policy towards new industries. The public utilities give active co-operation in the matter of seeing that the manufacturing institutions are supplied promptly and properly with the necessary facilities to make their operations economical and efficient.

Transportation Advantages

Peoria is served by thirteen steam lines and two electric lines as follows: Steam: A. T. & S. F., C. & N. W., C. B. & Q., C. & A., C. P. & St. L., C. R. I. & P., C. C. C. & St. L., Illinois Central, L. E. & W., M. & St. L., Pennsylvania, P. & P. U., and T. P. & W. Electric: Illinois Traction System, and the Peoria Railway Terminal Company. These railroads as parts of system represent a mileage of 63,508 miles.

One hundred and thirty-two passenger trains and 158 freight trains are handled in and out of Peoria daily. Its passenger and freight depots are conveniently located within a mile radius.

Peoria is located half-way between Chicago and St. Louis, and being a rate-breaking as well as a terminal point, it has a considerable advantage over other cities in the mid-west in the matter of freight rates and transportation service.

From a manufacturing standpoint Peoria is ideally situated. Aundant fuel supply is procured from mines practically within the switching district at a low rate. Inbound raw material is handled expeditiously at rates comparable with those for any similar movement. There are excellent terminal facilities.

The Peoria and Pekin Union Railway Company and the Peoria Railway Terminal Company operate terminal yards. The M. & St. L., C. B. & Q., C. R. I. & P., and Illinois Traction System have their own terminals. This gives switching facilities second to none as regards service and freedom from congestion at all times. Peoria has an adequate car supply when other cities are suffering from car shortage. This is due to the fact that Peoria is an interchange point and a natural route for the return of cars under the per diem rules. Terminal yards are large enough to avoid congestion and at the same time, of proper size and location as to permit special movements to be made advantageously when necessary.

Natural Distribution Point

As a distribution point, Peoria has an enviable location by reason of relative inbound freight rates and a favorable outbound basis combined with excellent transportation service both in and out. It is on account of these advantages that so many firms and industries use Peoria as a transit and distribution point for such commodities as grain and grain products, apples, alcohol, black strap molasses, sugar, vegetable oils, potatoes, eggs, lumber, etc. The existing freight rate structure permits these commodities to be brought into Peoria from various territories for transit and the same commodity or a product thereof, later reshipped to destinations throughout the United States at the through rate from point of origin to ultimate destination.

There is one thing in particular that Peoria holds out to the prospective industry or manufacturer, and that is the excellent merchandise service to any from this city. During the year 1923, Peoria railroads handled on an average of 185 cars of merchandise outbound each day. Arrangements have been made at transfer points to handle expeditiously, merchandise from Peoria so that there is very little delay incident to such shipments.

To sum it up, Peoria has adequate transportation facilities both on the line haul and in its terminal. Tonnage is sufficient to insure prompt movement both inbound and outbound. Peoria has a very favorable basis of class and commodity rates, comparable with any city to and from any destination.

Warehousing

Peoria has more than 250,000 square feet of fireproof sprinkled merchandise storage space, with an equal amount of non-fireproof space; also over 150,000 square feet of refrigeration. A stock in a Peoria warehouse places your product within 24 hours of 10,000,000 people, nearly one-tenth of the population of the United States. Peoria is indeed, so far as warehouses are concerned, in a well fortified position. Its warehouses are all located on private sidings, with free switching service.

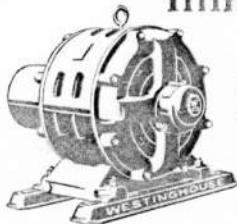

Danville is located just inside the Illinois line, 124 miles south of Chicago, 87 miles from Indianapolis, and 185 miles from St. Louis. It has a population of over 41,000.

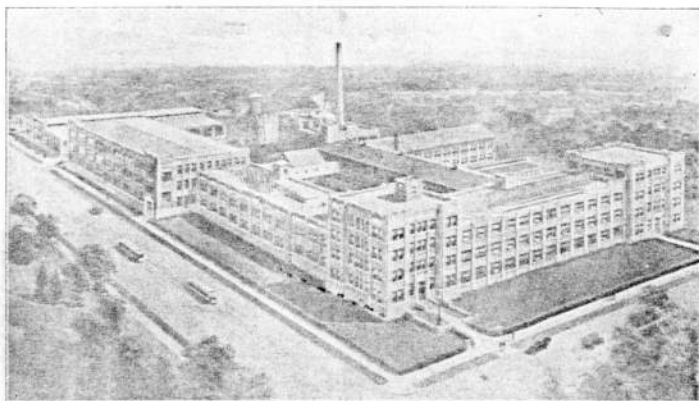

fine city-owned plant. Current is furnished for manufacturing purposes at a basal rate of $1\frac{1}{2}$ cents per K.W.H., with discounts of large consumption. Both of these power plants are continually expanding and are always prepared to take care of any demands which may be made upon them.

The labor supply of Springfield is the envy of other industrial centers. A visitor at any of our manufacturing plants is always impressed by the high type men and women employed here. A large percentage of them are home owners and permanent citizens. In the mines there is, of course, a large foreign element, but the factory employees are American or people of foreign descent who have lived in America for a generation or more.

Springfield merchants are noted throughout the State for fine stores and large stocks of various lines of merchandise. 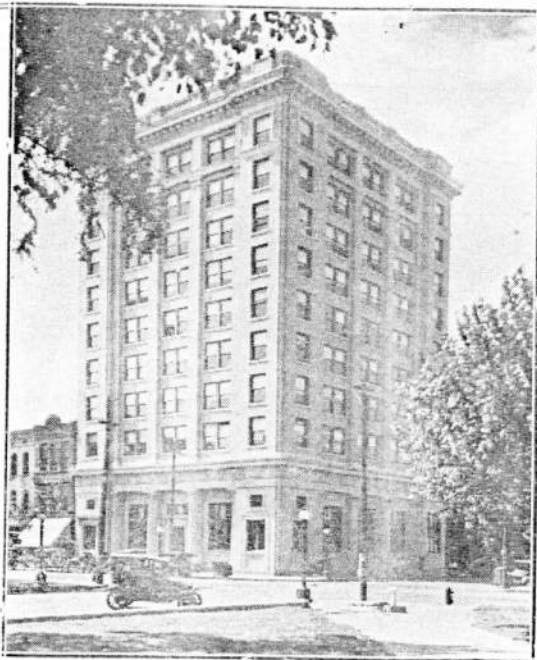

Educational advantages in Springfield are of the best. A fine school system with new and up-to-date buildings and equipment is maintained. Lincoln Library, the city library, has nearly 100,000 volumes in its shelves. The great State Library and the wonderful collection of law books at the Supreme Court Library make Springfield attractive to students and general readers.

The City Government is commission in form. A Park Board looks after parks and boulevards. A large and active Chamber of Commerce, a progressive Automobile Association, a Woman's Club, a Business and Professional Woman's Club, Civic Orchestra Association, Art Association, Amateur Musical Club and a host of fraternal orders and luncheon clubs furnish to all citizens opportunities for public service. There are seven grammar schools, a junior high school, and community school, and two parochial schools, together with fourteen churches, a modern hospital and a maternity home.

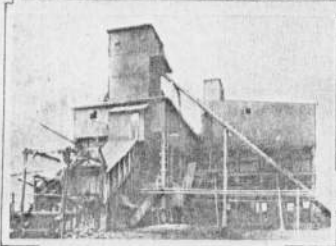
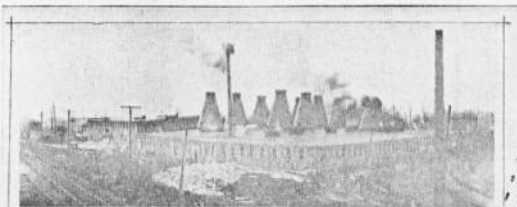
